

Cosmetology

The Cosmetology Program offers a variety of choices for people seeking entry-level jobs as well as currently employed individuals who wish to enhance their skills.

A diploma program and two certificate programs are available. Certificate and diploma credits may be applied toward an Associate in Applied Science Degree in General Occupational/Technical Studies. See a program advisor for more degree information.

Knowledge of the theories of hair, skin, and nail care is coupled with practice of the various techniques used in salons.

Major Units of Study

- Permanent Waving
- Hair Coloring and Lightening
- Hair Cutting and Shaping
- Hair Styling
- Manicuring/Pedicuring
- Facials and Skin Care
- Scalp Treatments
- Beauty Salon Management

Progression in the Cosmetology program is contingent upon achieving a grade of "C" or better in each course and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better (on a 4.0 scale).

After successfully completing the prescribed hours of instruction and six-month apprenticeship, graduates are eligible to take the examination administered by the Kentucky Board of Hairdressers and Cosmetology to become licensed cosmetologists.

Work Experience

Clinical work experience is performed on the public and students in an actual beauty salon atmosphere. Graduates also serve a six-month apprenticeship before taking the state board exam.

Diploma Programs

Knowledge of the theories of hair, skin, and nail care is coupled with practice of the various techniques used in salons. After successful completion of the prescribed hours of instruction and the six-month apprenticeship, program graduates are eligible to take the examination administered by the Kentucky Board of Hairdressers and Cosmetology to become licensed cosmetologists. Hours following Cosmetologist indicate length of instruction day.

Progression in the Cosmetology program is contingent upon achievement of a grade of "C" or better in each course and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better (on a 4.0 scale).

General Education/Applied Academics:

Six (6) credit hours are required for a diploma (An AAS in General Occupational/Technical Studies degree requires a minimum of 15 credit hours of general education). Six (6) hours may be taken from the following categories or * courses: Writing, Oral Communications, Mathematics, Science, Heritage/ Humanities, or Social Interaction. The *courses may be taken for a diploma but will not count toward an AAS Degree. *BET 120, 210, *EFM 100, *WPP 200, *TEC 100, 200.

NOTE: Hours following "Cosmetologist" indicate the length of the instructional day.

- Submit to the Admissions Office:
 - A completed application form
 - Official copy of high school diploma or GED transcript
 - Transcripts from other colleges or universities you have attended
 - Qualifying Test Score from COMPASS, ACT or ASSET
- Receive financial aid counseling and meet with VA/agency representative, if appropriate
- Attend Orientation—take Placement test as required, meet with advisor to plan schedule, and register for classes
- Pay tuition and fees
