EARN AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE

With 60 credit hours in specific courses, you can earn an Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS) degree and transfer to your chosen Kentucky public university as a junior.

This includes:

1. General education courses in written and oral communication, math, science, humanities and social/behavior sciences that are required for almost every bachelor's degree.
2. Elective courses in your chosen field. You can take classes to prepare for nearly 200 bachelor's degree programs in such fields as:
 - **Arts & Science:** art, biology, chemistry, English, foreign languages, geology, history, mathematics, physics, political science, psychology, sociology, theatre.
 - **Specialty Fields:** agriculture, education, engineering, nursing, social work.
 - **Pre-Professional:** dentistry, law, medicine, veterinary medicine, pharmacy, physician's assistant.

Most Kentucky colleges and universities offer scholarships for students who transfer from KCTCS. For more information, you can email the Advising Center at AS_ADVISORS@KCTCS.EDU.

KENTUCKY PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS

The KY General Education Transfer Agreement provides easy transfer to state public institutions:

1. Earn an Associate Degree and transfer 60 credit hours (or more).
2. Transfer general education courses as a block of 33 credit hours or as individual courses.

 - Placement test scores (ACT, KYOTE) or complete placement testing
