

The Associate Degree Nursing program prepares graduates to provide and manage client care and to become members within the discipline of nursing. Intrinsic to the three roles of the nurse — provider of care, manager of care, and member of the discipline — are the eight core components of nursing practice.

The eight core components are:

- Professional behaviors
- Nursing process
- Communication
- Clinical decision making
- Caring interventions
- Teaching/learning
- Collaboration
- Managing care

These core components are introduced, developed, and built upon throughout the curriculum. Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

The Associate Degree Nursing curriculum is organized around a clearly defined conceptual framework and combines general education and nursing courses. The nursing courses correlate classroom and clinical instruction in a variety of community agencies.

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

## SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS

Acceptance into the Associate Degree Nursing program is based on a selective admissions process. See the current application on the Associate Degree Nursing website for details on selection requirements.

In order to be considered for selective admission, applicants must comply with college admission requirements prior to **Feb. 1**, for admission to a fall Nursing 101 course. Pre-requisite courses must be completed prior to the first day of Nursing 101, if accepted.

## REQUIREMENTS

Progression in the program is contingent upon achievement of a grade of "C" or better in each biological science, nursing and mathematics course and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better (on a 4.0 scale).

CPR requirements must be successfully completed prior to enrolling in the first nursing course and must be kept current throughout the program.

Documentation of successful completion of a minimum 75-hour nursing assistant course, or its equivalent\*, is required prior to enrolling in the first nursing course.

Transportation to the community agencies is the responsibility of each student.

\* Navy Corp School OR Army Medic School OR LPN licensure OR previous successful completion of a fundamentals theory/skills course in a pre-licensure program waive this requirement.

# ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING Application Checklist

**1** Have a current ACTC application on file.  
*If you are enrolled in the current semester, you do not need to re-apply.*

**2** Completed application to the Associate Degree Nursing Program.

**3** Official copy of high school transcript or GED scores **AND** official transcripts from any post-secondary education. *(Transcripts are only official if legible and transmitted from school to school.)*

**4** Student must have a Global GPA of 2.5 or higher to be considered for admission.

**5** Results of the ACT or equivalent placement tests.
