



Practical Nursing Program Information (Revised March 2018)

Program Description: The Practical Nursing (PN) Program prepares individuals to practice under the supervision of a registered nurse, licensed physician or dentist. Use of the nursing process at the PN level toward the maintenance of health and prevention of illness, observation and nursing care of persons experiencing changes in their health processes, and the evaluation of health practices of patients are emphasized.

Practical Nursing Program Student Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of this program the student can:

1. Assume the role of a competent, caring practical nurse in a variety of health care settings under the direction of a registered nurse, licensed physician or dentist.
2. Use the human caring phenomena and the nursing process in providing nursing care.
3. Demonstrate self-direction and responsibility for maintaining nursing competence by pursuing personal and professional growth.
4. Communicate effectively with all members of the health care team.
5. Demonstrate accountability of practice with adherence to ethical and legal standards of the profession.

Miscellaneous Program Information:

- Classroom instruction in theory and basic nursing skills is provided on campus. Under the guidance of program faculty, students gain valuable experience in the care of clients of all ages in a variety of health care settings and/or community agencies- including hospitals, long-term care facilities, clinics and child care centers. Transportation to class, lab and the community agencies is the responsibility of each student.
- Acceptance in the Practical Nursing program is based on a selective admission process. Selection of students for the program will be made by a Practical Nursing Admissions Committee. Admissions will be based on a weighted points scale. Please refer to the "Selective Admission Score Sheet" for areas in which points may be earned. Points will only be granted for course work and test scores that are on the student's record by the application deadline.
- Students are admitted to the program in the Fall Semester of each year. College applications and class schedules are on the web at www.ashland.kctcs.edu
- Progression in the Practical Nursing program is contingent upon achievement of a grade of "C" or better in each course and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better (on a 4.0 scale).
- The Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN) may deny a nursing graduate admission to the NCLEX-PN Exam if an individual has been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony that involves acts that bear directly on the qualifications of the graduate to practice nursing.
- Enrollment in the Practical Nursing program may be limited because of available clinical/ laboratory facilities, as well as faculty and financial resources.
- Admission is open to all qualified students regardless of economic or social status and without discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, sex, marital status, beliefs, age, national origin or disability.
- In addition to other qualifications, the college will, in compliance with KCTCS regulations and in the manner and to the extent permitted by law, endeavor to provide opportunities to all students in order to promote diversity among the student population in the Practical Nursing program.
- CPR (Healthcare Provider Course) requirements must be successfully completed prior to enrolling in the first nursing course and must be kept current throughout the program.
- Documentation of active status on the Medicaid Nurse Aide Registry or successful completion of an equivalent course within the previous three years is required prior to beginning PN program courses.
- Information regarding tuition fees, costs of books/online resources, uniforms, etc. can be found on the ACTC website (See "estimated cost breakdown" on the PN web page).
- All students admitted to the program are required to submit documentation of immunizations and a current TB test. PN students are also required to complete a drug screen and background check arranged through the program at the student's expense in order to participate in learning at various clinical sites.

The applicant is responsible to see that the following requirements are met and that all documents required for application are on file in the admissions office no later than May 11, 2018. Please place your initials on the lines beside each circle indicating the requirement has been or will be met and return this form with your completed application.

- _____ Nursing at the technical level involves the provision of direct care for individuals and is characterized by the application of verified knowledge in the skillful performance of nursing functions. **All students should possess sufficient:**
 1. Visual acuity, such as is needed in preparation and administration of medications, and for the observation necessary for patient assessment and nursing care;
 2. Auditory perception to receive verbal communication from patients and members of the health care team and to assess health needs of people through the use of monitoring devices such as cardiac monitors, stethoscopes, IV infusion pumps, fire alarms, etc.;
 3. Gross and fine motor coordination to respond promptly and to implement the skills, including manipulation of equipment, required in meeting health needs;
 4. Communication skills (speech, reading, writing) to interact with individuals and to communicate their needs promptly and effectively, as may be necessary in the individual's interest; according to KAR 314.051(1)(c) An applicant for a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse shall file with the board a written application for a license verified by oath, that the applicant; (c) Is able to understandably speak and write the English language and to read the English language with comprehension;
 5. Intellectual and emotional functions to plan and implement care for individuals.

- _____ Official high school transcript indicating that the applicant has or will complete a high school course of study or a passing GED official score report.
- _____ Official transcripts of all postsecondary work completed at other institutions.

- _____ Will have proof of successful completion of a Medicaid Nurse Aide equivalent course with a grade of "C" or better within the past three years or proof of active status on the Medicaid Nurse Aide Registry by the first day of PN courses.
- _____ Will have a current Healthcare Provider CPR card prior to the first day of NPN courses.
- _____ Have view online advising conference on the ACTC PN Website and submit proof of completion form with application.
- _____ Global GPA of 2.5 or higher (on a 4.0 scale)
- _____ Demonstration of computer/digital competency or equivalent computer literacy course, such as DLC 100 or CIT 105 (3 credit hours) with a grade of "C" or better prior to the first day of NPN courses.
- _____ Completion of all prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better prior to the first day of NPN courses (see PN Program Curriculum page).
